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POPE FRANCIS ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

THE HUMAN ROOTS OF THE ECOLOGICAL CRISIS

101. It would hardly be helpful to describe symptoms without acknowledging the human origins of the ecological crisis. A certain way of understanding human life and activity has gone awry, to the serious detriments of the world around us.

I. TECHNOLOGY: CREATIVITY AND POWER

102. Humanity has entered a new era in which our technical prowess has brought us to a crossroads. We are the beneficiaries of two centuries of enormous waves of change: steam engines, railways, the telegraph, electricity, automobiles, aeroplanes, chemical industries, modern medicine, information technology and, more recently, the digital revolution, robotics, biotechnologies and nanotechnologies. It is right to rejoice in these advances and to be excited by the immense possibilities which they continue to open up before us, for 'science and technology are wonderful products of a God-given human creativity'.⁸¹

105. There is a tendency to believe that every increase in power means 'an increase of "progress" itself', an advance in 'security, usefulness, welfare and vigour; ... an assimilation of new values into the stream of culture',⁸³ as if reality, goodness and truth automatically flow from technological and economic power as such. The fact is that 'contemporary man has not been trained to use power well',⁸⁴ because our immense technological development has not been accompanied by a development in human responsibility, values and conscience.
